#### COURSE DESCRIPTION

Speakers will discuss emerging techniques in fracture care such as percutaneous plating of humeral shaft fractures; fracture reduction using a kyphoplasy balloon; negative pressure wound care; management of large bone defects; and nonreconstructable periarticular fractures. There will be conversations about controversial fracture management topics including open, articular, clavicle, femoral neck, pelvic and acetabular fractures, and flail chest injuries. Additionally, the conference will cover deliberations on surgical techniques not yet in the textbooks, clarification of on- and off-label use, balancing technology with economic realities, obtaining informed consent, and coding for trauma and fracture care. Attendees will leave the conference more knowledgeable about emerging innovative techniques for treating orthopaedic trauma and fracture care.
