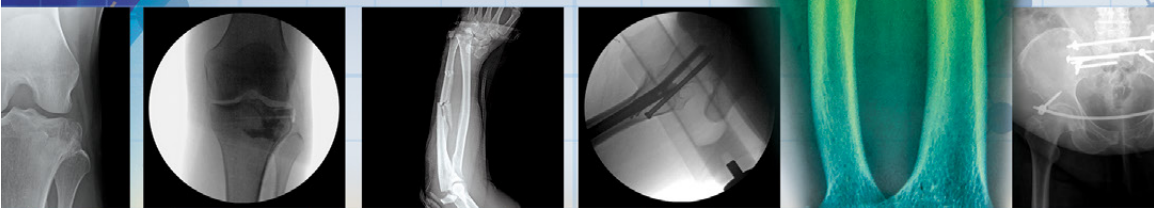

COURSE DESCRIPTION & REGISTRATION

THIS COURSE is designed to educate orthopaedic surgeons on existing core principles in trauma and fracture care, challenge dogma, explore emerging techniques and technology, and continue improving. 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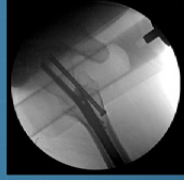
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
